Performance Report – 3rd. Quarter July to September, 2019

Introduction

The Commission was established in 1996 by the Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka Act No.21 of 1996. The Act sets out the legal basis and operational principles of the HRCSL. Although reference to the HRCSL has been made in the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, it is not formally established by the Constitution. The Chairperson and Members of the Commission are appointed under the provisions set out in the Constitution.

The Act recognizes the jurisdiction in the Commission in terms of fundamental rights and human rights. Fundamental rights are certain civil and political rights as well as economic, social and cultural rights guaranteed in Chapter III of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka. Human rights are defined in the International Law.

The statutory functions of the Commission are:

- to inquire into, and investigate, complaints regarding procedures and violations or imminent violations of fundamental rights, with a view to ensuring compliance with the provisions of the Constitution.
- to advise and assist the government in formulating legislation and administrative directives and procedures, in furtherance of the promotion and protection of fundamental rights;
- to make proposals to the Government regarding measures to be taken to ensure that national laws and administrative practices are in accordance with international human rights norms and standards.
- to advise the Government regarding subscribing or acceding to treaties and other international human rights instruments.
- to promote awareness of, and provide education in relation to human rights.(Section 10 of the Act No. 21 of 1996)

The Commission carried out its functions with a staff consisting of 148 members. For the purpose of implementing its mandatory functions, the Commission consists of four divisions of Inquiries and Investigations, Education & Special Programmes, Research & Monitoring and Administration & Finance as well as 10 Regional Offices. (Ampara, Anuradhapura, Badulla, Batticaloa, Jaffna, Kalmunai, Kandy, Matara, Trincomalee and Vavuniya) Every Division functions under a Director while each Regional Office functions under a Regional Co-ordinating Officer.

During the period under review a host of activities were launched by the Commission which are analyzed in the Report.

The Commission had to handle matters relevant to various incidents arisen as a result of attacks carried out on the Easter Sunday including the ethnic violence unleashed targeting the Muslim Community on the 13th of May and thereafter.

The Commission hastened to respond by appealing to the general public to resist from unleashing counter-violence, drawing the attention of various state authorities to the necessity of curtailing the practice of discrimination—against the Muslim Community, holding and facilitating community dialogue throughout the Island and conducting inquiries and investigations into numerous complaints lodged with the Commission. The Commission also made use of mass media platforms to draw the attention of the general public to the necessity of respecting equal citizenship and engaging in peaceful and amicable courses of action to settle disputes.
