The Final Report of the Committee appointed by the Human Rights Commission to inquire into disappeared and missing persons in the Island during the period from 1980 to 1999.

Introduction to the 2210 cases of un-inquired Disappearances

- The history of the 2210 cases of un-inquired disappearances has been mentioned in several reports to the HRC and in concept papers prepared by the Project Manager of the Disappearances Data Base Project.
- These are complaints dating back to the 1990's some received by the all Island
 Presidential Commission, some received from NGOs and others referred to the
 Secretary to His Excellency and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs by both local and
 foreign sources.
 - By the letter dated 14.03.2005 the Secretary to His Excellency, has authorized
 the HRC to inquire into these complaints under the provisions of the HRC Act.
 Please see Annexure X.
 - These cases had not been inquired into by the All Island Presidential Commission as they had been received after the last date of receiving complaints by the former Presidential Commissions which were appointed for the Southern Central and North Eastern Zones in 1995.
- The Asia Foundation had provided funds within the Disappearances Data Base Project – Budget to study the 16,000 complaints referred to the HRC, and find out exactly the number that will have to be inquired into.

- 4. The coders of the Disappearances Data Base Project had been deployed to work on this assignment during a lull period in the Disappearances Data Base Project work when the Coding forms were revised until Statistical advisors settled on a final coding form.
- 5. In the process of eliminating duplicates the 16,000 figure had come down to 10656. Questionnaires had been sent to these complainants and according to the responses received, the final numbers to be inquired into by the districts were as follows.

- As the Asia Foundation had no funds to provide for this project they agreed to release a very small amount of money – a savings from an earlier project to commence these inquiries.
- Hence a three months short term plan was prepared commencing on 01.11.2006 to do inquiries relating to the disappearances of persons in the Colombo, Kalutara and Gampaha Districts from the DDB project Office at No:15, Swarna Road, Colombo 06.

The manner in which we were appointed

The Committee comprising of retired District Judge Mr.K.G.Jayasena as the 8. Chairman, retired Senior Superintendent of Police Mr. H.S. Jayasuriya as the and retired Government Agent, Investigating Consultant Mr.W.Ekanayake as the Secretary were appointed by the Human Rights Commission when your predecessor Justice Ramanadan was the Chairman. Appointments were made under section 11 b of the Human Rights Commission Act to inquire into 2210 un-inquired complaints it had received regarding the disappearances and involuntary removal of persons in all districts. A schedule of these disappearances province by province is at Para 5. Justice Ramanadan handed over to us our letters of appointments where we have entered into a contract in the first instance for three months with your Commission for the period from 01.11.2006 to 31.01.2007. As the Asia Foundation funds were exhausted the HRC provided the money for the balance inquiries to be completed. Thereafter these contracts have been renewed for periods of three months, two months and for 15 days and our contract with your Commission terminates on the 15th of October 2007.

Terms of reference

- The terms of reference that had been handed over to us is given below.
 - I Whether the person in the annexed list provided by the HRC has been involuntarily removed or have disappeared during the period mentioned by the complainants.
 - II All the circumstances pertaining to the alleged involuntary removals or disappearances.
 - III The present condition and whereabouts of the persons alleged to have been so removed or to have so disappeared.
 - IV Reports made by complainants that the missing persons are being held in unidentified prisons & places of detention.
 - V The evidence available for identifying the person or persons responsible for these alleged disappearances and the findings based on such evidence.
 - VI The relief if any that should be provided to parents spouses and dependants of the persons alleged to have been removed or to have been disappeared.

Logistical Data and commencing of proceedings

10. We were provided a room in the building rented out by the HRC for the DDB Project of the Human Rights Commission pertaining to the collection of data at No:15, Swarna Road, Colombo 06. We commenced proceedings on the 06th of November 2006 and concluded our sittings on the 12th of July 2007. During this period summons were issued to 2210 complainants to come before us and give

evidence. However only 650 complainants were able to be present before us. We also received letters from 113 complainants stating that due to various difficulties they will not be able to personally be present before us. We sent a letter to these complainants to forward to us an affidavit. We received about 113 affidavits. However we observed that these affidavits had not been properly filled up. The important data given in these affidavits have been scheduled and annexed to this report marked annexure S We will later comment on the facts that transpired in these affidavits.

The service of summons and the difficulties of complainants

- 11. With regard to the service of summons most of the summons were sent by Registered Post at the beginning. Subsequently due to lack of funds these summons were sent by Ordinary Post. During our tenure of office we were also confronted with two or three postal strikes. Due to these strikes we observed that the complainants received their summons long after the day on which they had to be present before us to give evidence. We also wish to state that in the North and East where summons were dispatched some complainants could not travel to Colombo due to the present security situation prevailing in the country.
- 12. Most of the complainants who came to give evidence before us were very poor. Some of them had to borrow money to come to Colombo. In fact one complainant who came before us was cheated of the money she had when she requested another woman to assist her to find our office from the Colombo bus stand. As she had no money we had to provide her with some money to travel back to her home in Welimada. We also wish to place on record that some of the witnesses who came from Jaffna and from Batticaloa had expended over Rs:10,000 to be present before us. In most of these instances the witnesses had borrowed money to come before us.
- 13. With regard to the previous committee appointed to inquire into disappeared persons in the Jaffna region, it is observed that the committee met in Jaffna on several occasions and adequate notice was given that sittings would be taking place in various parts of Jaffna. Further as far as we are aware they had sufficient

funds to pay the witnesses travelling expenses. Where our Committee is concerned we never had any extra funds and at a certain point of time as

mentioned earlier we barely had funds to send our letters by Ordinary Post instead of Registered Post.

The typists who assisted us

14. At the start of our proceedings as we did not have an English typist the proceedings were typed in Sinhala by Mrs.Chamila Sajeewani De Silva. Due to this we had difficulty in translating these statements into English especially when we had to prepare the summaries of each investigation. During the past two months we have been able to prepare summaries of each complainant's statement which will be of easy reference to any reader of this report. We shall refer to these summaries later. From about December to January we were able to have the services of Mrs. Nilanthi Nonis as our English Typist. After her contract was over we were able to obtain the services of Mrs. N.W. Chandima Kularathna who was attached to the Data Base Project as a Project Assistant

The feelings and the educational standards of the complainants

15. The HRC Disappearances Data Base Project had sent a yellow form to the complainants requesting them for certain material particulars. We found that most of the complainants who came to give evidence before us had not received much of an education. Some of them could not read and write. Some could only write their name. Fortunately they were able to understand Sinhala and Tamil. In fact in about 95% of the forms that had been filled and received by the Data Base Project facts had been entered by some one else other than the complainant. However the complainants stated that they provided the information to fill the form. We also found that the complainants were from very poor families we also have to comment on the fact that buckets of tears flowed from the eyes of the complainants when they gave evidence to us. In fact we were of the impression that after they gave evidence, the complainants felt that they had unburdened their hearts to us.

Occupations of the persons who disappeared

- 16. From the evidence of the complainants we gathered that most of the persons who disappeared were ordinary people who lived by occupations of day to day living. Most of these disappeared persons were engaged in the occupations of labourers, cultivators, fishermen, fish vendors, vegetable vendors, brick makers, cement block makers, wood cutters, coir rope makers, wood sawers, boutique keepers, persons who worked in boutiques, welders, mechanics, barbers, tailors, tea pluckers, persons who looked after cattle, painters of Hindu kovils, cinnamon peelers, toddy tappers etc.
- 17. Apart from the above occupations there were others who were teachers; clerks, forest officers, reserve police constables, police constables, STF officers, Army officers, Grama Niladharis, Grama Araksha Niladharis and under graduates who have disappeared.
- 18. It must be mentioned in addition to the occupations mentioned above there have been about seven Buddhist priests who have disappeared during this period. Some of them have been taken into custody whilst they were in their temples and the others when they were away from the temples. We also observe that a young lad had been taken into custody by the Army in Jaffna when he had gone to a kovil to worship.

The ages of the persons who disappeared

19. We also found of the persons who disappeared were from the ages of 65 to an infant. From these persons about 122 persons were below the ages of 21. Most of them were students. Some of the students who disappeared were of the ages of 10 years, 15 years, 16 years, 17 years and 19 years. They were students of the Madya Maha Vidyalayas and also schools such as St. Selvesters College, Kandy and Vidyartha College, Kandy. Further we found there were about 120 husbands who have disappeared. These husband's ages range from 19 years to 65 years. Except for a very few of them all had children. In some cases the children gave evidence of the disappearance of their parents. In fact in one instance the father had been shot at home through the ears in the presence of the children. We also

found that when 20 of these husbands disappeared their wives were pregnant and they delivered their babies after the disappearance of their husbands.

Comment on the Males and the Females who have disappeared

20. The majority of the persons who disappeared were males. There were about 5 females who had disappeared. In two instances two mothers have been taken away from their homes and subsequently the dead body of one mother partially burnt was discovered. This mother was taken away when the husband was not at home. A girl of about 16 years of age had been abducted by some persons. She was raped and killed and her body was found dumped into a well. In another instance in Jaffna a young girl had gone to the post office to post her application for an examination, thereafter she had disappeared.

Burdens cast upon the wives and children

- 21. Because of the death of their husbands the burden of running the family fell on the shoulders of the wives. Some of them left their children with the grand parents and obtained jobs in the Middle East. Others worked as labourers and servants and brought up their children.
- 22. In one instance after the father disappeared the mother died of a fit whist she was bathing in the Ethawetunuwewa. The children had to work as servants in their relation's homes and make a living. In another instance a brother committed suicide after he lost his elder brother. It must be mentioned to the credit of the women whose husbands disappeared that very few of them remarried. Most of them devoted their whole life for the upbringing of their offspring.

The Government Authorities or Terrorist Organizations responsible for the disappearance of these persons

23. As mentioned in paragraph 14 we have prepared the summaries of each statement we have recorded and are annexed to this report. According to these summaries the following Government Authorities are responsible for the disappearance of the persons mentioned there in. We also give below the amount

of the total number of persons that have disappeared due to these authorities and other terrorist organizations.

Persons who have disappeared due to arrest made by the Army

As mentioned above most of the disappearances had been due to persons taken into Army custody. A perusal of Annexure A will reveal that the Army had installed units in various parts of the country to keep arrested persons in custody. Our inquiries revealed that there have been occasions that persons have given information against the others who were their enemies due to land and private quarelles to gain vengeance of their enemies through the Army. The summaries also revealed that young school boys who had been forced to paste posters by the JVP had been taken by the Army and destroyed. Most of the people who have been taken into custody by the Army had been taken in the night or in the early hours of the morning from their homes. The reasons on some occasions the Army had given for taking these persons into custody had been that they were taking them for an inquiry or to record their statements. The Army had never informed

the persons who had been taken into custody as to what offence they had committed. The non informing of the charge to those who have been taken into custody by the members of the Army is a gross violation of article 13(1) of our constitution. It is also in evidence that some of the dead bodies that were on the roads had been collected by Army vehicles. There is also evidence that the Army had set fire to the houses of suspects. The names of a few Army officers have transpired during our investigations who had been concerned in these disappearances. They are as follows.

Anura Abeysiri Lorance Rohan Lieutenant Rohan Rajapakse Lieutenant Mallikarachchi Luxman Obeysekara Abeykoon Bandara

- 25. The complainants who referred to these names did not know most of the ranks of the above officers. Most of these names are underlined in the summaries. There was a Habeas Corpus application in HC Colombo case No HGA 10491 against Abeykoon Bandara and two other police officers. They were discharged due to lack of evidence. There was another Habeas Corpus application filed against Lieutenants Rohan Rajapakse and Mallikarachchi. According to the complainant in this inquiry evidence of 4 witnesses had been led. The complainant is not aware of the out come of this inquiry.
- Our inquiries also revealed that on or about four or five occasions the Army had visited the refugee camps in the Batticaloa area and taken away several young people and they have not returned. In fact in one instance according to a complainant they had taken 165 young people including her son and they had not returned.
- Our inquiries also revealed that several Army officers have lost their lives when the LTTE attacked the Mulativu Army camp.

- 28. There have been a few occasions when the Army had taken two or three persons as hostages because they could not find the accused that they wanted. In some instances when the accused was handed over the hostages had been released. In another instance when the hostage was handed over subsequently the hostage was released and the man who was arrested disappeared.
- 29. There is also a very interesting incident where a man and his wife had gone to the jungle to answer a call of nature, when the Army had come and arrested her husband.
- 30. The Army also had taken about two persons into custody on mistaken identities. These persons have disappeared. It must be mentioned that a complainant stated that her husband and three of her sons had been taken into custody by the Army and thereafter they have disappeared. This had occurred in the Eastern Province.

Persons who have disappeared due to arrest made by the Police

- 31. A perusal of Annexure B will reveal that about 173 persons were taken into custody by the Police had disappeared. In the same way as the Army, these persons have been taken into custody most of them from their homes whilst they were sleeping in the night or early in the morning.
- 32. In the same way as mentioned with regard to the Army no charge had been explained to those who had been taken into custody by the Police. In certain instances they have said that they were taking the suspects to record their statements or to conduct an inquiry. In certain instances they had been given the assurance that they would be sent home once the inquiries were over. However none of them returned home. By not informing the persons who were arrested of the offence for which they had been arrested the Police had violated article 13(1) of our constitution.
- 33. Our inquiries also revealed that the police had established a special unit in Negombo under SP Kudahetty. They have also established a Special Police Post at Kundasale. Several persons had been taken into custody by these special units.

34. During the course of our inquiries the names of the following police officers transpired to have been concerned in some manner in these disappearances. It must be mentioned that this is what transpired in the statements of the complainants.

- With regard to the police it must be mentioned that in one instance the Naula police had sent two messages for two sons of a complainant to call over at the police station on two different days. The complainant had taken her two sons to the police station and on one occasion had handed over her son to PC Sumana Bandara. Both her sons never came home. With regard to the 2nd son that was handed over to the police when the complainant visited the police station the blood stained clothes of her son were handed over to her.
- 36. In another instance the mother had handed over her son at the AGA's office, Alawwa to Mr. Ukkubanda who in turn handed over her son to the Alawwa police officers. The complainant stated her son never came home. There are a few other instances where persons had surrendered to the police but they never returned.
- 37. We also wish to report that a complainant stated that she was in hospital for the confinement of her 4th child. Her three daughters were alone with her husband at home. That night the police had come to their home in the middle of the night and had taken her husband away. Thereafter he never came home.
- 38. There had been about seven Habeas Corpus applications filed against some of the above police officers. In one case filed against SI Nimal Fernando, he had been ordered to pay Rs: 150,000 to the complainant. In another case filed against IP Ellepola of the Kurunegala police, the complainant said that the court found in guilty. But he did not know what punishment was meted out to him. In several of these Habeas Corpus applications the accused have been discharged due to the lack of evidence.
- 39. If one peruses annexure B it will be observed that many complainants have stated that when they visited police stations to make complainants with regard to the disappearances of their relations the police had refused to record their statements or assaulted them or abused them and chased them away from the police stations.

In fact some complainants stated the entrance to the police station was blocked and as such they could not enter the police station. Some complainants from the Baddegama area stated that on many occasions when they went to see the OIC of the police station in order to make a complaint he was never available. This action of the police is a violation of chapter 11 of the code of Criminal Procedure Act where the police are duty bound to record information with regard to offences.

- 40. In fact a complainant from Maho stated that her son was detained by the Maho police and she had taken meals to him. When she went to make a complainant to the Maho police with regard to the arrest and detention of her son the police had recorded her statement to say that her son had disappeared and she requested the police to assist her to trace her son. Not only in this instance there were several other instances where the police had distorted the statements made by the complainants if allegations were made against the Army or the Police.
- 41. There have been some interesting remarks made to complainants by some OICC of police stations. In one instance an OIC had said to a complainant "I am sorry for what happened to your son but the orders to make him disappear came to us from Head Quarters." In another instance when the complainant met the OIC the OIC had informed the complainant that she should give an alms giving insinuating that her son had disappeared. In another instance when a mother went to a police station to complain regarding the disappearance of her son the Police had informed her "Don't complaint to us. Complaint to the government."

Disappearances that had occurred due to Army and Police operations.

42. According to Annexure C 23 such disappearances have taken place. Our inquiries revealed that there have been several Army and Police joint operations which had been conducted mostly in villages of the Eastern Province. Details of these operations are in Annexure C.

Disappearances due to the Army or the Police

43. Please see Annexure D. There have been 7 disappearances where the complainants could not specifically state whether the persons who came in uniform were from the Army or the Police. However they said that these persons came armed with fire arms.

Disappearances caused by the Army or the JVP or Army and JVP

44. Please see Annexure E and F. Four such disappearances have taken place in one instance in a family, the Army had taken into custody a person who had assisted the JVP and the JVP had taken the husband and wife into custody.

Disappearances caused by the Sri Lanka Air Force

45. Please see Annexure G. It will be observed that the Air Force had taken into custody a person who had been earlier taken into custody by the Army and released.

Disappearances caused by the Sri Lanka Navy

46. Please see Annexure H. Two of these disappearances had taken place on land and the other two on the sea.

Disappearances caused by the JVP

47. Please see Annexure J. 32 persons have disappeared due to the JVP. In fact the JVP was the cause for the disappearances of most of the persons during this period. According to the complainants in certain instances JVP supporters had visited homes masquerading as Army officers. Most of the persons they removed were killed in the vicinity of the victim's homes. In fact one instance they shot her father in the presence of his children. There mode of killing was mainly with a sharp cutting instruments. There was a complainant who stated that the JVP

supporters warned her husband for consuming Alcohol. As he did not heed this warning he was stabbed to death.

- 48. In another instance where a father was killed and his body was found in a fire-wood shed close to his home. A letter was found written by the JVP where instructions were given that the funeral should take place within two days and the coffin should not be carried beyond nine inches above the ground.
- 49. There was also another instance where they ordered a father to get his sons to resign from the Army and subsequently killed his son when he came home. In another instance they burnt the house of two police officers killing their mother, sister, uncle and their niece. Whilst the two police officers attended the funeral ceremonies of these persons who were killed, the JVP abducted both of them and they thereafter never returned.
- 50. There was also an instance where a mother was taken away from home when the husband was absent. The inmates were ordered to hoist a black flag. Subsequently inmates found their mother's body burnt on the road. The body was found at short distance from their home.
- 51. The JVP supporters also got members of a family to wear JVP posters on the front and the rear of their shirts and marched to the Ankumbura police station. As mentioned earlier the JVP supporters forced young boys to paste their posters in their villages in consequence to which the Army and the Police arrested these boys and they never came home. In one or two instances the JVP requested some persons to contribute paddy and some other items and those who refused to contribute were brutally killed.
- 52. In another instance a man who supplied bread to the JVP was arrested by the Army or the Police causing him to disappear.

Disappearances caused by the LTTE

53. Please see Annexure K. 30 persons have disappeared due to the LTTE. These disappearances have been caused due to the attacks of the LTTE in the bordering villages of Welioya. Especially in the vicinity of the Ethawetunuwewa tank. Some of these persons have been killed and the others have been abducted. Several Grama Arakshaka Niladharis have been killed due to these LTTE attacks. Further several Army officers have been killed due to the LTTE attack on the Mulativu Army camp. Due to the LTTE attacks a husband who was 65 years old and having 10 children had been killed. The most gruesome incident with regard to the LTTE attacks was when a mother was breast feeding her infant a shot had pierced through the infant and killed her. Several little girls who had taken shelter in the jungle due to the LTTE attacks have also been killed.

Disappearances caused by the LTTE and EPRLF

54. Please see Annexure L. This is a very interesting incident. According to the complainant her son was first abducted by the EPRLF. Subsequently her son was been transported to India by boat by the EPRLF, when the LTTE attacked the boat and took her son. The complainant does not know what had happened to her son up to now.

Disappearances caused by the Black cats

55. Please see Annexure M. There are six disappearances cases by the black cats. The black cats appeared to be supporters of the government in power at that time.

Disappearances caused by Political supporters

56. Please see Annexure N. There are three cases which have been caused by political supporters. Several names of Politicians transpired including high ranking officers.

Disappearances caused by Murder and Rape

Please see Annexure P. During the course of our inquiries we found that there were 14 cases of murder which included a case of rape. Some of these cases have been investigated by the police and some accused have been indicted in the High Courts. In one case the accused have been found guilty of a lesser offence and given a suspended sentence and in another case they have been ordered to pay Rs:500 crown cost. In some cases the accused had been discharged due to lack of evidence. In two cases dead bodies had been discovered and identified by witnesses and the cases are pending. It must be also mentioned that it would have been very difficult for the police to inquire into these murder cases due to the prevailing conditions during that period.

Disappearances caused by people who are unknown

Please see Annexure Q. There are 131 cases where disappearances have been caused by persons who are unknown. The complainants were not able to identify the persons who caused these disappearances. In some of these disappearances when the complainants visited the police stations to make a complaint they were chased away and their complaints were not recorded. From the evidence that have transpired in our inquiries we find that the police never recorded the statements of complainants if they were aware that the disappearances had been caused by the Army or the Police. Therefore one could assume that some of these disappearances may have been caused by the Police or the Army.

Statements not recorded due to young age and not been present

59. Please see Annexure R. There are two such instances. These complainants could not be recorded because in one instance the complainant was 3 years old at the time of the incident and in the other instance was that the complainant did not come before us.

Violation of article 13(4) of the constitution.

60. With regard to the disappearances caused by the Army, Police, Air Force and the Navy it must be mentioned that the officials concerned of these organizations had violated article 13(4) of our constitution which states "No persons shall be punished with death or imprisonment except by order of a competent court, made in accordance with procedure established by law. The arrest, holding in custody, detention or other deprivation of personal liberty of a person, pending investigation or trial, shall not constitute punishment.

Contents of the affidavits

61. As mentioned in paragraph 10 we received 113 affidavits. The summary of these affidavits are annexed at annexure S. It will be observed from these affidavits that the following authorities and terrorist groups have been responsible for the disappearance of the persons mentioned in the affidavits. We also observed that in 33 of these affidavits no compensation had been paid.

Payment of compensation

62. According to inquiries made by us the payment of compensation had been done in the following manner.

- 63. With regard to government servants Army and Police officers the payment of compensation deferred according to regulations.
- 64. Our inquiries revealed that most of the complainants who came before us had been paid compensations except for 120 persons. Please see Annexure T which gives names of the disappeared persons and the names of the complainants to whom compensation had not been paid. The criteria to pay compensation was that the complainant should produce a statement made to the police and a death certificate to the Divisional Secretary's office which is commonly known as the Pradeshiya Lekam Karyalaya.
- 65. We found that in most instances the statements made to the police had not been correctly recorded. When the complainant stated that the disappearance was caused by the Police or the Army it had been recorded as abducted by unknown persons. With regard to the death certificates the cause of death in most of them had been given as missing for a period of over one year and presumed dead or abducted by unknown persons and killed.
- 66. In the payment of compensation two or three complainants alleged that the full payment was not made to them. They had been paid Rs:3,000 or Rs:5,000 short.
- 67. All complainants requested that if it is possible, for us to recommend further payment of compensation. They also requested that if it was possible to obtain government employment to their children who possessed the requisite educational qualifications.
- 68. Wherever possible we have endeavored to mention in the summaries the complainant's requirements for their children.
- 69. With regard to the payment of compensation to complainants who have not been paid any compensation that transpired in the evidence and in the affidavits we have here with annexed an annexure marked U.

Brief report with regard to our terms of reference at paragraph 9

- 70. We wish to draw your attention to Paragraph 9 which gives our terms of reference. The above report and the summaries attached to the report would answer the questions raised in our terms of reference 1, 2 and 3. With regard to terms of reference IV our inquiries did not reveal that any person who had disappeared with regard to the inquiries that we conducted are presently at any unidentified prison or place of detention. The summaries we have prepared is the only evidence we have to identify some of the persons who were concerned for the alleged disappearances. We are also of the opinion that our findings are insufficient to take any criminal or departmental action against them.
- 71. According to terms of reference six subsequently in this report we have submitted the particulars of the complainants who have not been paid any compensation for the disappearance of their loved ones in accordance with the evidence we recorded and in the particulars of the affidavits forwarded to us.

Steps taken by the Secretary Mr.W.Ekanayake with the concurrence of the Chairman to obtain relief for the dependants of the disappeared persons.

- 72. With the above purpose in view Mr.Ekanayake has interviewed officials of the following Ministries and Departments. In response to our invitation, the following officers attended our office and discussed the assistance schemes available and requested us to send lists of needy dependants to arrange required assistance on a basis of priority. They also wished that copies of such correspondence be sent to the respective. Divisional Secretaries as most assistance schemes are implemented at that level.

- Officers who came from 1,2 &3 explained in detail the possibilities of assisting the dependants of the disappeared through the many development schemes giving them priority if such lists could be sent to the respective Divisional Secretaries with copies to the Secretaries of the Ministries.
- 74. From the NGO sector the Secretary had interviewed 1 and 2. They were happy about the Committees' approach to arrange relief for those who came for inquiries and also who reached the Committee by affidavit. But their main grievance was the non implementation of many recommendations made by the earlier Presidential Commissions.
 - 1. Rights to life Miss. Jayanthi Dandeniya
 - Organization of Parents and Family members of the disappeared- Mr. Shantha D. Pathirana

Recommendations

75. We strongly recommend that compensation be paid to the parents or relations mentioned in Annexures S and T to whom compensation had not been paid earlier. We also recommend that the wives and dependants of four Grama Arakshaka Niladharis whose particulars are mentioned in file Numbers ANP/515/1599/S, ANP/333/1520/S, ANP/177/834/S and ANP/168/920/S who had lost their lives and whose wives are paid only Rs:2,500 a month by way of salaries be paid at least Rs:5,000 or more a month because the present salary of the Grama Arakshaka Niladharis has been raised Rs:13,000 a month.

76.

The complainant requested us as to whether we could intercede with the education Department and obtain some payment for her mother as her brother had joined the Education Department in 1985 and disappeared in 1991 August.

Heenmahaththaya was 27 years old at the time he disappeared. He was unmarried. Later they made a complainant to the Buttala police. The parents had received Rs: 25,000 as compensation. Her father and mother are old and feeble. They have no income and they seek an allowance from the government.

These same persons on the same night had gone to her eldest brother Sarambage Thilakasiri's house and shot and killed him. On the following day, her mother made a complaint to the Walasmulla police station. The police conducted an inquiry but no accuse were arrested. Her mother was paid Rs: 65,000 as compensation by the Katuwana Pradeshiya Sabha with regard to the death of her father and her elder brother.
